Double Yellow Lines

In case you hadn't noticed, double yellow lines have been added to the first and second blocks of north Main Street. These were added in an attempt to keep people from making "J" turns in front of businesses, and also from making "J" turns when backing out of a parking space. Both turns are dangerous to traffic and pedestrians. Please use caution when parking on Main Street, and avoid making "J" turns.

Places to Eat

Haviland has a variety of places to satisfy your need for food and beverage.

Dolly's Diner is open 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Tuesday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Saturday, 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Sunday, and is closed on Monday.

Dolly's has a varied menu as well as daily specials, a breakfast buffet on Friday evening from 5:00 to 8:00 p.m. and a buffet on Sunday.

Vic's Hardware and Convenience Store is open from 6:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, 6:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon Saturday, and closed on Sunday. Vic's is more than just a place to buy hardware and groceries. It's a place to gather, drink coffee and visit with friends. Get a sandwich, chips, and a soft drink to eat at the table or take with you. It's great to have a grocery store in town, and bags of ice are also available.

Origin's Coffeehouse is open 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday, and closed on Sunday. Origin's is a unique shop offering coffee, latte, smoothies, Italian soda, and a large variety of flavors. Homemade baked goods are sold every day. Live music is featured on Friday evenings. This is a great place to sit, relax, and enjoy the atmosphere with the beverage of your choice. Origin's also sells jewelry, gift cards, books, T-shirts, candles, and a variety of other gift items.

The **Bear's Den** on the Barclay College campus is open 6:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. seven days a week. They serve burgers, sandwiches, pizza, ice cream, polar bears, soft drinks, etc.
