*** Mayor's Musings ***

I'm going to start off with what I said at the end of "Mayor's Musings" in the October issue of City Clips. If you don't remember what it was here is a quote: "Water project update – USDA has approved loan funds in the amount of \$1,556,000 and grant funds of \$879,000. The project should be completed in approximately two years. I need to state here that the council and I are completely against this entire project and the fact that we are putting the city in debt for the next 40 years for something we feel is entirely unnecessary. We are being forced to do this by the KDHE and the EPA. For this I apologize."

That being said, we have spent a lot of time in the last two months trying to find a way around this whole thing. After much wailing and gnashing of the teeth we have taken bids on interim financing and the equipment that processes the water. So it looks like we are still on track for the system to be up and running within two years. You have probably noticed the sticker on your water bill saying that the water rate is going up. This is of course to help pay for the reduced nitrate water system.

As to the street paving project, we have petitions signed for 54% of the project. We decided to do this as a whole project if we had at least 51% or not do any of it if we had less than 50% so as to eliminate the hit and miss situation we have now. It should be started by early summer.

On a different note, our code and animal enforcement officer, Joel Halverstadt, will be working hard to see that all dogs and cats have current shots, and are licensed with the city. If your animals do have city tags, each tag is valid until April 30, 2015. We will have a pet clinic in April and the new tags will be available at that time. You will receive more information on the pet clinic at a later date. If your animals do not have city tags, please stop by the city office to purchase them and bring proof of current shots. Tags for neutered or spayed animals are \$1.00 each and for animals that are not neutered or spayed, tags are \$3.00 each. Water Rate Increase

The following monthly rates for the sale of water to all consumers by the Water Department of the City of Haviland, Kansas shall be charged and collected beginning January 1, 2015 (1st billing date will be January 31, 2015)

- 1) For the first two thousand gallons (2,000) of water, or portions thereof: twenty-two dollars (\$22.00);
- 2) For the next ten thousand gallons (10,000) of water, or portions thereof: two dollars (\$2.00) per each one thousand gallons (1,000);
- 3) For all water in excess of twelve thousand gallons (12,000): two dollars and twenty-five cents (\$2.25) per each one thousand gallons (1,000).

Code Enforcement Officer

Keep Streets Clean

When mowing grass, raking leaves, trimming bushes, please don't allow grass clippings, leaves, etc. to end up in the street. These items will find their way into the storm sewer and often cause clogs. Thank you for your help with this.

Siren Testing

Kiowa County will be testing the storm sirens every Saturday at 12:30 p.m. for 30 seconds, except as follows:

- A Severe thunderstorm or tornado watch or warning is in effect at the time of the test, or has been in effect within six hours preceding the time of the test.
- Severe weather is forecast for any period up to 6:00 p.m. the day of the test.

Automatic Water Payment

The City has an agreement with Haviland State Bank so that you can authorize payment of your water/sewer/trash utility bill through a checking or savings account. This is a free service to our customers. You can bank anywhere in the country and take advantage of this service. If interested, call or e-mail the office, and the form will be sent to you.

"J" Turns

"J" turns continue to be a problem on Main Street. There are double yellow lines and NO J TURN signs on the first and second blocks of north Main Street. These were added to keep people from making "J" turns in front of businesses, and also from making "J" turns when backing out of a parking space. Both turns are dangerous to traffic and pedestrians. With addition of the signs, you can be ticketed. Please use caution, obey the signs, and stop making "J" turns.

Nisly Trash Service

Trash is picked up every Wednesday and carts should be out by 6:00 a.m.

Recycling is the 4th Wednesday of each month and is free - carts should be out by 8:00 a.m.

If you have both trash and recycling, the carts need to be placed at least five feet apart, and not put next to a vehicle or any other obstacle. Do not leave emptied carts on the street.

If your trash or recycling is not collected, please call or email the office as soon as possible. Leave a phone message if calling before 10:00 a.m.

NEW POLICY: Nisly will now be closed on the following holidays: New Year's Day, Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. Ways to Conserve Water

Save water while preparing food.

- Use a brush and bowl of water to clean food instead of letting the water run.
- Thaw frozen food in your refrigerator or microwave, not under running water.
- Reuse water when you can. For example, when you cook vegetables, save cooking water for soup stock.

Use less water to clean your home. Use a pail or basin instead of running water. Also, use a sponge mop instead of a string mop (sponge mops use less water and take less water to keep clean).

Presoak items such as grills and oven parts overnight. Then scrub with an abrasive brush or pad.

Nitrate Quarterly Report

DRINKING WATER WARNING CITY OF HAVILAND WATER HAS HIGH LEVELS OF NITRATE DO NOT GIVE THE WATER TO INFANTS UNDER SIX MONTHS OLD OR USE IT TO MAKE INFANT FORMULA

Water sample results collected December 15, 2014 from Well #1 showed nitrate levels of 12 mg/L (which is the same as last quarter), Well #2 showed nitrate levels of 13 mg/L (which is down one from last quarter), and Well #3 showed nitrate levels of 15 mg/L (which is the same as last quarter). This is above the federal nitrate standard or maximum contaminant level (MCL) of 10 mg/L. Nitrate in drinking water is a serious health concern for infants less than six months old.

What should I do?

- ❖ **DO NOT GIVE THE WATER TO INFANTS.** *Infants below the age of six months who drink water containing nitrate in excess of the MCL could become seriously ill and, if untreated, may die. Symptoms include shortness of breath and blue baby syndrome.* Blue baby syndrome is indicated by blueness of the skin. Symptoms in infants can develop rapidly, with health deteriorating over a period of days. If symptoms occur, seek medical attention immediately.
- ❖ Water, juice, and formula for children under six months of age should not be prepared with tap water. Bottled water or other water low in nitrates should be used for infants until further notice.
- ❖ **DO NOT BOIL THE WATER.** Boiling, freezing, filtering, or letting water stand does not reduce the nitrate level. Excessive boiling can make the nitrates more concentrated, because nitrates remain behind when the water evaporates.
- ❖ Adults and children older than six months can drink the tap water (nitrate is a concern for infants because they can't process nitrates in the same way adults can). However, if you are pregnant or have specific health concerns, you may wish to consult your doctor.

What happened? Nitrate in drinking water can come from natural, industrial, or agricultural sources (including septic systems and run-off). Levels of nitrate in drinking water can vary throughout the year. We'll let you know when the amount of nitrate is again below the limit.

What is being done? Funding has been approved from USDA for the installation of an ion exchange system. Installation will begin this year and the estimated date for completion is May 1, 2016. We continue to work with Alan Luttrell, Engineer with EBH & Associates to help us in the process of staying in compliance with the State. We are also working with John Haas, Ranson Financial with the financial process. Remember, that we do have an R/O unit attached to the fire station where you can get drinking water.

Publishing of Ordinances and Resolutions

We are required to publish all new ordinances and resolutions in the City's designated newspaper, The Merchant's Directory, which is published in Mullinville. Many of you do not take the paper, so with the quarterly newsletter, we now have another way to publish these items.

RESOLUTION NO. 100

A RESOLUTION DETERMINING THE ADVISABILITY OF THE MAKING OF CERTAIN INTERNAL IMPROVEMENTS IN THE CITY OF HAVILAND, KANSAS; MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS WITH RESPECT THERETO; AND AUTHORIZING AND PROVIDING FOR THE MAKING OF THE IMPROVEMENTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUCH FINDINGS (STREET IMPROVEMENTS).

WHEREAS, a petition (the "Petition") was filed with the City Clerk of the City of Haviland, Kansas (the "City") proposing certain internal improvements; and said Petition sets forth: (A) the general nature of the proposed improvements; (b) the estimated or probable cost of the proposed improvements; (c) the extent of the proposed improvement district to be assessed for the cost of the proposed improvements; (d) the proposed method of assessment; (e) the proposed apportionment of the cost between the improvement district and the City-at-large; and (f) a request that such improvements be made without notice and hearing as required by K.S.A. 12-6a01 *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the City hereby finds and determines that said Petition was signed by the owners of record of more than one-half of the area liable for assessment for the proposed improvements, and is therefore sufficient in accordance with the provisions of K.S.A. 12-6a01 *et seq.* (the "Act").

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF HAVILAND, KANSAS:

Section 1. Findings of Advisability. The governing body hereby finds and determines that:

- a) It is advisable to make the following improvements (the "Improvements"):
 - 1) Construct 51.5' from back of curb to back of curb street improvements in the City, on Topeka, from Maple to Walnut (paving only) ("Topeka Portion of Improvements");
 - 2) Construct 31' from back of curb to back of curb street improvements in the City, on Emporia, from Maple to Walnut ("Emporia Portion of Improvements");
 - 3) Construct 35' from back of curb to back of curb street improvements in the City, on Lawrence, from Walnut to Oak ("Lawrence Portion of Improvements");
 - 4) Construct 31' and 35' from back of curb to back of curb street improvements in the City, at Poplar and Emporia, and one block in each direction ("Poplar and Emporia Portion of Improvements");
 - 5) Construct 31' and 35' from back of curb to back of curb street improvements in the City, on Lawrence, from Cherry to Sycamore, and on Sycamore, from Lawrence to Wichita ("Lawrence and Sycamore Portion of Improvements");
 - 6) Construct 31' from back of curb to back of curb street improvements in the City, on Wichita, north of Sycamore ("Sycamore and North Wichita Portion of Improvements"); and
 - 7) Construct 35' from back of curb to back of curb street improvements in the City, on Poplar, from Kingman to Wichita, and on Pratt from Poplar to chestnut ("Poplar and Pratt Portion of Improvements");all in accordance with City standards and plans and specifications prepared or approved by the City Engineer.
- b) The estimated or probable cost of the proposed Improvements is:
 - 1) For the Topeka Portion of Improvements, \$63,563.52, to be increased at the pro rata rate of 1 percent per month from and after the date of adoption of a resolution authorizing the Improvements;
 - 2) For the Emporia Portion of Improvements, \$69,816.42, to be increased at the pro rata rate of 1 percent per month from and after the date of adoption of a resolution authorizing the Improvements;
 - 3) For the Lawrence Portion of Improvements, \$67,446.88, to be increased at the pro rata rate of 1 percent per month from and after the date of adoption of a resolution authorizing the Improvements;
 - 4) For the Poplar and Emporia Portion of Improvements, \$299,695.20, to be increased at the pro rata rate of 1 percent per month from and after the date of adoption of a resolution authorizing the Improvements;
 - 5) For the Lawrence and Sycamore Portion of Improvements, \$460,849.22, at the pro rata rate of 1 percent per month from and after the date of adoption of a resolution authorizing the Improvements;
 - 6) For the Sycamore and North Wichita Portion of Improvements, \$95,556.38, at the pro rata rate of 1 percent per month from and after the date of adoption of a resolution authorizing the Improvements; and
 - 7) For the Poplar and Pratt Portion of Improvements, \$237,525.52, at the pro rata rate of 1 percent per month from and after the date of adoption of a resolution authorizing the Improvements;
- c) The extent of the improvement district (the "Improvement District") to be assessed for the cost of the Improvements is: See **Exhibit A** attached hereto.
- d) The method of assessment is: equally per front foot.

In the event that unplatted property within the Improvement District is platted after adoption of this Resolution, each platted lot shall be equally assessed for the costs associated with the unplatted property.
- e) The apportionment of the cost of the Improvements between the Improvement District and the City-at-large is:

- 1) For the Topeka Portion of Improvements, 79% to be assessed against the Improvement District with frontage on a 51.5' street and existing curbing and 21% to be paid by the City-at-large;
- 2) For the Emporia Portion of Improvements, 58% to be assessed against the Improvement District with frontage on new curbing, 10% assessed against the Improvement District with frontage on existing curbing and 32% to be paid by the City-at-large;
- 3) For the Lawrence Portion of Improvements, 93% to be assessed against the Improvement District and 7% to be paid by the City-at-large;
- 4) For the Poplar and Emporia Portion of the Improvements, 36% to be assessed against the Improvement District with frontage on a 31' street and new curbing, 2% assessed against the Improvement District with frontage on a 31' street and existing curbing, 40% to be assessed against the Improvement District with frontage on a 35' street and new curbing and 23% to be paid by the City-at-large;
- 5) For the Lawrence and Sycamore Portion of Improvements, 34% to be assessed against the Improvement District with frontage on a 31' street and new curbing, 47% assessed against the Improvement District with frontage on a 35' street and new curbing, 5% to be assessed against the Improvement District with frontage on new curbing, but no new paving, and 14% to be paid by the City-at-Large;
- 6) For the Sycamore and North Wichita Portion of Improvements, 57% to be assessed against the Improvement District with frontage on a 31' street and new curbing and 43% to be paid by the City-at-Large; and
- 7) For the Poplar and Pratt Portion of Improvements, 75% to be assessed against the Improvement District with frontage on a 35' street and new curbing and 25% to be paid by the City-at-large.

Section 2. Authorization of Improvements. The above said Improvements are hereby authorized and ordered to be made in accordance with the findings of the governing body of the City as set forth in **Section 1** of this Resolution.

Section 3. Bond Authority; Reimbursement. The Act provides for the costs of the Improvements, interest on interim financing and associated financing costs to be paid by the issuance of general obligation bonds or special obligation bonds of the city (the "Bonds"). The Bonds may be issued to reimburse expenditures made on or after the date which is 60 days before the date of this Resolution, pursuant to Treasury Regulation 1.150-2.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Resolution shall be effective upon adoption. This Resolution shall be published one time in the official City newspaper, and shall also be filed of record in the office of the Register of Deeds of Kiowa County, Kansas.

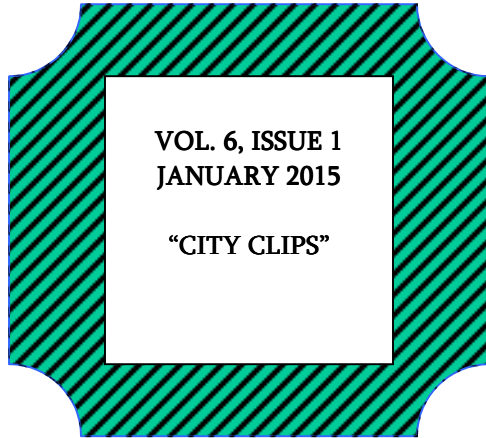
